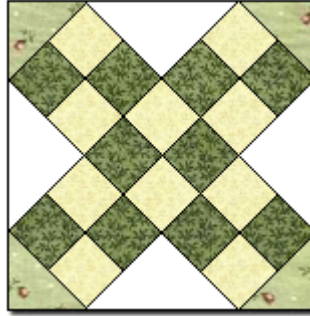


Grandmother's Cross

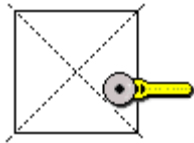

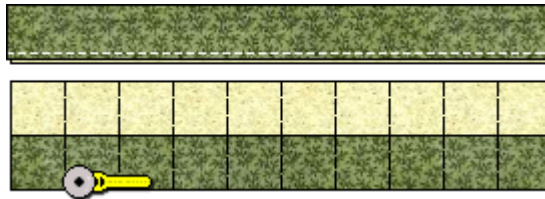
** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



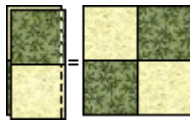
Start by marking and cutting the Color 3 $3\text{-}\frac{7}{8}$ " x $7\text{-}\frac{3}{4}$ " strip into two $3\text{-}\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Stack and cut these once on the diagonal to make four half square triangles for the block's corners...



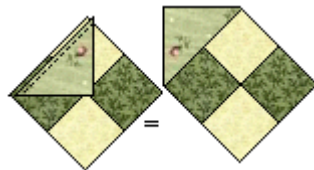
Next mark and cut the Color 4 $7\text{-}\frac{1}{4}$ " square on both diagonals to make four quarter square triangles for the block's sides...



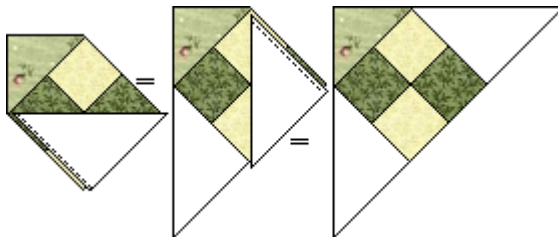
Now sew together the Color 1 and Color 2 $2\text{-}\frac{5}{8}$ " x $26\text{-}\frac{1}{4}$ " strips, right sides together, along one long edge using a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Press the seam to the darker side. Mark and cut at $2\text{-}\frac{5}{8}$ " intervals...



Flip alternating strip units and sew pairs of these together to make five four patch units as shown at left...



Then sew a Color 3 triangle to one side of two four patch units...noting the direction of the four patch colors before you sew! Press seams towards the triangles...



Now sew a Color 4 triangle to either side of the two units we just made, pressing seams towards the triangles...on to [Page 2!](#)

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
