Kelly Urtel explained what editor of the Guild Newsletter entails because we are in need of a new one.

The summer picnic will be held in August, since there are no conflicts. Unanimously approved. Jayne outlined upcoming programs:

February – Denise from Auntie's Attic will discuss color theory and will do a follow-up workshop if desired.

March – Theresa Waiter will discuss the connection of the Underground Railroad and quilts. Sheryl Lynch will have 2 sessions on making a sweatshirt jacket in March and April.

Please let Jayne know if you're interested in a free-motion clinic – it would be a how-to-do and practicing patterns. People would be available to provide info on tips and info and be available to help and guide during workshops. She also has hand quilters available to do a clinic.

We will be joining QCNYS.org - Quilters Consortium of New York for \$45 annually. Sharon Drumm has volunteered to be our primary representative, with Judy Phillips following up.

Diane Brodfuehrer explained "Sleep in Heavenly Peace" which provides beds for children in need. They will accept twin size quilts to go along with the beds they make.

month of March. Send in small items with the owner's name. If library patrons inquire about whether an item

is available for sale, library staff will contact the committee, who will get the information to the quilter.

Guests sign up and receive flower pin. Please introduce yourself to anyone wearing a pin. Informational

pamphlets also available.

Membership – Liz Wheeler – She has packets available which include sign up and explanation of committees, pin,

By-laws and how to make name tag. She has receipts for cash, but checks need to be turned into

Treasurer.

Newsletter – Kelly Urtel – discussed previously

Pink Ribbon – Joan Rockenbrock – Since 2009 we have been making breast cancer pillows. Brief how-to, 4 pieces

fabric, sew RS together from peak to peak, alternating colors(dog bones), turn into canoe, sew together,

leaving fist sized opening. Back stitch ends. February 24 – Pillow Day, cutting and packaging at Salem UCC.

Donna Mileham – Chemo hats, brief how-to, 2 pieces, sew 17" sides of long piece together, fold WS together,

pin at quarterly marks, do the same with circular pieces, match pins and sew together. Program Helpers – Judy Phillips – helps V.P., obtains ideas on-line, from other guilds, and/or FaceBook for

ideas for meetings and workshops. If you have an idea for a National Teacher, get it to her by February.

Project Linus – Linda Szmanda, Cindy Hubacher – take donated money to purchase backing and quilt fabric

(members also donate) to form kits containing material, batting, backing, binding, and pattern to be

assembled, completed and returned. 152 were made last year. Adding 19 turned in tonight, total 6,688 total

as a guild in over 20 years. On Feruary 24 at Salem UCC a joint workshop with Pink Ribbon from 9-3. Doris

and Bonnie will do crumb squares for blocks. Batting donated by a cancer center. ALL quilts are washed.

Bring a sewing machine or needles for crocheting around edges. Lunch provided. Crumbs can be brought to

next meeting - scraps 2 1/2" or larger, strips 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " or wider.

Quilter's Challenge – Dee Judy - \$5 to buy kit and participate, they'll come up with an idea and you have to finish

and bring it to the Christmas party. If you bring it to party, you get \$5 back. Members vote and prizes are given.

Raffle Quilt –Karen McMurdo – quilt made for biannual quilt show. A charity is picked to donate proceeds to.

Refreshments/Kitchen – Faye Vogt – provide water, cups, napkins and plates, and clean up afterwards. Need 6-8

People sign up to bring snacks each month in a notebook at the end of the food table. Summer Picnic – Kelly Miller – pot luck meal with possible contest for placemats which are donated to Meals on

Wheels.

Sunshine – Jill MacDougall – sell tickets for 50/50, \$1/2 tickets. Half given to name drawn, other half goes to Guild

which is used for sympathy, get well cards and postage. Self sustaining.

Walker/Wheelchair bags – Barb Newman, Mary Wells – brief how-to on wheelchair and walker bags given.

Instruction sheets are available from the committee when picking up kits. Quilt Show – Cheryl Shoemaker - will be April 2025. Start collecting books and patterns for book room, fabric for

mystery bags and items for raffle bags.
