The return of the comfort pillow stuff-n-sew!

Please join me at the North Tonawanda Public Library - Meadow Dr. near the high school, on Saturday, January 17th from 9:30 a.m. until noon. We will be in the community room.

I will have plenty of already sewn together pillows, all you will need to do is stuff them! I will also provide the stuffing and some needles and thread for you to stitch up the holes after they are filled. Please feel free to bring your own scissors. I will also have tags, pink ribbons and pins to attach to each completed pillow.

At the January 7th Guild meeting I will also have packets of cut out pillow pieces, "bones", if you would like to take any home to sew together. There will be instructions in this newsletter. Please above *All Else* make sure that you leave the stuffing hole big enough to fit at least four of your fingers inside! Some of the holes are quite small which will make it difficult for stuffing.

I will have sign up sheets available for you to attend the library stuff-n-sew, as well as taking home pillow kits. This way I can track how many might be in circulation.

Thank you for helping bring back the comfort pillows to our pink ribbon committee!

PINK RIBBON COMFORT PILLOW



Finished Size: Approx. 6" x 14"



DIRECTIONS


- 1- Sew bone shapes together in sets of two.



The ends look remarkably like quarter square triangles!



- 2- Turn one of the sets right side out.
- 3- Slip the right side out set inside of the wrong side out set.
- 4- Match up the cross seams at the top and bottom points of the bones shapes. Fold the seam allowances opposite each other at the intersecting point.
- 5- Sew the two sets together leaving an approx. ~~1/2"~~ ^{4-5"} opening.
- 6- Turn right side out and stuff with polyester stuffing (I love Soft Touch Stuffing, it bounces back very well).
- 7- Turn the seam allowances of the opening inside of the pillow. Whip stitch the opening closed with tiny, hidden stitches. ENJOY!


My wish for the 2026 to ask everyone to please try to make 1 Linus quilt--from a kit or your own stash.
