## Minutes from the April 2, 2025 meeting

Meeting called to order at 6:35 by President Deb Marshall

Officers present:

President – Deb Marshall Co/Vice Presidents – Joan Rockenbrock and Rene' Harbison Treasurer – Kelly Miller

Secretary – Donna Clark

Liz Wheeler made the motion to accept the March minutes and Dru Lis seconded.

Financial reports are on the tables. Kelly Miller asked that anyone needing start-up money for the quilt show notify her.

**Program** – "Going Back to Basics" presented by Joan Rockenbrock

Pressing – if you stitch, **PRESS**. The next block for our mystery quilt is an 8" **finished** pinwheel block. She suggested several ways to make 2" **finished** half square triangles. You can use Thangles, half square triangle papers or the standard way. Cut 3" squares, 2 right sides together. Draw a diagonal and sew ¼" on each side of the line. Cut on the line. Press the seam flat first to set the seam. Then press OPEN, then press to the dark side. It takes 4 HST's to make a pinwheel. Make sure they all go the same way. Make 4 pinwheels for a block. Need to contrast between dark/light or medium/light {can use background}. You need to make one block. It can be scrappy or all the same material. Directions will be in the next Newsletter. Press the center of the completed block. If it's too thick, hammer it. Your **unfinished** block will measure 8 ½" and will be made of 4 pinwheel blocks (16 HST's)

#### **New Business:**

Judy Lilac will take raffle ticket money and tickets.

Pam Labushesky discussed the NYS Shop Hop, from May 1-June 30. Magazines currently sell for \$12.95 which include maps, hours, patterns and page to be stamped for prizes. There are currently 16 Shop Hops going on in the country. New York's has 5 regions, with 59 shops, approximately 12-15/ region. Riley Blake designer made NY fabric which is \$12.95/yd. and can be pre-ordered to pick up after May 1<sup>st</sup>. Each shop has a "hopper" on shelf. If you find and bring to register, you're eligible for a weekly prize. Cheryl Shoemaker discussed the NYS Consortium. Next meeting June 18<sup>th</sup> in Palmyra. She needs a volunteer to attend. Anyone attending the Toronto Show and who made a deposit, will be receiving material soon. We have Consortium Passports for our quilt show. It is a shop hop for stores and quilt shows. All are in the NYS Shop Hop. ANYBODY can buy a Passport and you need 8 or more stamps to turn

in for prize drawing. It's \$5 for a passport, and they will be located by the raffle quilt. Your passport should be turned in by December 1<sup>st</sup>. There is a 20% coupon in it for Aurora sewing stores. We'll have a basket at the show, value \$50, for Consortium members only.

# Mystery Quilt - Clue 2

## Clue #2 Pinwheels

For this block you will be making 2" finished half square triangles. You will be using either your background fabric or 2 fabrics that have enough contrast to see the pinwheels when they are finished.

There are several ways to get to the finished square. You can use Thangles (2" finished strip), Triangulations (2" finished) or by cutting 1 - 3" square from 2 different fabrics. Place the 2 fabrics right

sides together making sure all sides are even. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Stitch 1/4" on

either side of the line and PRESS. Cut on the drawn line and open the seam and PRESS again. Remember this is a seam that is on the bias, so PRESS do not iron. Ironing would be placing the point

of the iron at the beginning of the seam and pushing it along the seam to open it up. This might stretch

the seam and distort your block. Pressing will make sure that the seam is fully open and flat. You now

have 2 choices. You can leave the seam open or you can now PRESS the seams to the darker side.

Now is the time to square up. If you have a 2 ½" square, this will make trimming easier. Making sure

your corners of the square align with the sewn line of the square. Trim off all extra fabric. If you are using Thangles or Triangulations there should be no need to square up if you cut and stitched correctly.

You will now make 15 more. Your block should look like the following and measure 8 1/2".

### Milestone Madness

Check out your UFO's and make a list of what you want to do with them. Make a list to bring to the guild and keep one for yourself. If you want to finish it, if it needs to have binding on, if it needs more fabric, if it needs to be cut and even if it needs to go to another home put it on your list. If you accomplish it, bring it to the guild meeting and we will check it off your list. For each accomplishment your name will go into the Milestone Madness box and at the December party there will be prizes.
