Joan presented "Tips and Tricks" - What to do when it goes wrong.

- 10 Foot Test walk 10 feet from your project, if you can't see the mistake ignore.
- Ugly Block stick it in the middle, surrounded by beautiful blocks.
- Galloping Horse if anyone walking by can't see it, ignore.
- Helen Keller if it's an obvious bad block, applique another block over it.
- Alcohol have a drink, then come back to it. Work through it.
- Throw it out!
- "That fabric had a mind of it's own" deal with it, finished is better than not completed.
- Embrace your seam ripper and start over.
- Do NOT sew when you're tired.
- Always buy extra fabric if you can.
- Enjoy the process, if not enjoying, walk away.

Next month we'll discuss basting.

TCQG Program

Last month we focused on allowing us to embrace our not so perfect bits in our quilts.

The 10 foot test - if you can't see it 10 feet away, it's good enough

Ugly block - put it right in the middle and surround it with all the beautiful blocks.

Do your worst - if things are going well, get scrap fabric and make a totally horrible block and get it out of your system.

Galloping horse - if you can't see it while galloping by it on your horse, leave it.

Helen Keller - if Helen Keller can see it, fix it.

Fabric has a mind of its own - sometimes the fabric just does not want to cooperate - step back, have a glass of wine and try again the next day.

Finishing is good enough - After it's done and washed the quilt will have that antique feel and it's amazing how many of those imperfect bits can't be seen.

Embrace the seam ripper - if you are not thrilled with any part of your quilt, take it apart, press and fix anything that needs to be fixed.

Don't sew when tired - it is sure to come back and bite you in the butt. Too tired = many mistakes

Always buy extra fabric - we all make mistakes, make sure you have enough fabric to fix anything that needs to be.

Enjoy the process - even the difficult times - they are learning moments.

Next month it's Sandwich time. We will be discussing different ways to put your layers together and get it ready for quilting.




