Chopped Italian Sub

Ingredients:

8oz. deli sliced ham

8oz. deli sliced turkey

8oz. deli salami

8oz. pkg. sliced pepperoni

8oz. deli provolone cheese

1 red onion
3-4 tomatoes
Banana peppers (to your taste)
½ can to 1 can black olives (optional)
I head of lettuce or bag of shredded lettuce
Mayonnaise
Olive oil
Balsamic vinegar

You will chop, chop, chop the ham, turkey, salami, pepperoni, provolone, red onion, tomatoes, peppers, olives mix together in a bowl.

Add half the bag of shredded lettuce, or half the head of lettuce (which you chopped)

Lightly drizzle olive oil and balsamic vinegar and mix.

Add a tablespoon of mayo at a time—just enough to mix and hold it together.

Serve on sub rolls.

I found this is messy—I serve it on top of a bed of shredded lettuce
